Sharon Moody Uria was elected to Plantation City Council in March 2003, and is currently serving her third term. She is a 23-year resident of Plantation, and has strong ties to the residential and business community through memberships with the Plantation Historical Society, Friends of the Helen B. Hoffman Plantation Library, Plantation Kiwanis Club and the Greater Plantation Chamber of Commerce. She also attends the Calvary Chapel in Plantation.

She previously served on the Plantation Volunteer Fire Association Pension Board for eight years.
