

Thrower Park located at 20 SW 63rd Avenue has undergone a complete renovation. For over 50 years, a large Banyan Tree occupied the .30 acre lot, welcoming residents and serving as a buffer and screen for the west entrance of Plantation Park. Hurricane Wilma brought the beloved tree down, leaving a large void felt by both residents and community.

Today, Thrower Park has been restored with a whole new look. Paved paths, benches and a family of trees and shrubs consisting of: Sabal Palm, Gumbo Limbo, Jamaica Dogwood, Sea Grape, Japanese Fern, Brazilwood, Pitch Apple, Florida Thatch, Royal Poinciana, Sausage Tree, along with Jamaica Caper, Croton, Mexican Bamboo Grass, Firebush, Muhly Grass, Coontie and Flax Lily have been planted. Together, is hope that this generational grouping of natives and tropicals will thrive and protect one another should another storm come our way.
