

Yellow Tabebuia
Tabebuia caraiba
Family: Bignoniaceae

The Yellow Tabebuia Tree is well- known for its abundant, yellow, trumpet- like flowers which begin blooming in the spring. Another identifying characteristic is the trunk, which is often crooked and leaning. This is a great tree for small spaces and under power lines, as it grows to only about 25' tall. The Yellow Tabebuia likes full sun and well- drained soils. The bark of this tree is corky and the fruits are pods that grow to about 4" long.

As with all trees in the City of Plantation, please make sure that they are of the Florida #1 or better quality. This means the tree has one central leader (not several) and good branch structure with branches evenly spaced around the trunk. Roots should grow away from the trunk, not circle or girdle it. Please be sure to follow proper planting procedures!
