

Trees for Tomorrow

A program to enrich the lifestyle of the City of Plantation and its residents, Trees for Tomorrow is designed to encourage residents, friends of Plantation, commerce and organizations to commemorate events and achievements, or to honor someone close to them by planting shade and flowering trees at parks throughout the City.

Imagine the joy of taking a young child to the park for the first time to show them the tree planted to mark the occasion of their birth. Realize the satisfaction gained from being a part of the team that sets a new company production benchmark as you picnic in the grove of trees sponsored by your company and planted to date stamp the event.

A Few Points of Information

A 6-inch by 10-inch plaque that accompanies the tree recognizes the common name of the tree, as well as the botanical name. Verbiage concerning the reason the tree was planted will be limited in nature and is subject to the City's final approval. Words such as In Memory Of and Date of Birth and Death will not be permitted. Statements such as In Recognition Of and In Honor Of are acceptable.

Tree Species. The species of trees to be planted will be determined by the Department of Design, Landscape and Construction Management and the Parks and Recreation Department in order to keep a consistency of our parks' canopy. We will make every effort to entertain requests such as a flowering tree or other available species.

Perpetual Care. The City will supply and plant the trees. On-going maintenance will be provided. Should a tree be severely damaged, die, or be felled by natural causes beyond the City's control, the City cannot be held responsible for the replacement of the tree. However, every effort will be made to replace the tree in a timely manner.
