FPL to resume disconnections

According to an article published in yesterday's Sun Sentinel, FPL issued a press release announcing they will begin discontinuing service for those who are past due on their electric bills. According to the article, FPL suspended disconnections in March due to Covid related issues, however will begin the process again starting in October. Per an FPL spokesperson, customers who are behind in their bills are being asked to reach out for assistance. He stated the utility will try to work out arrangements with those customers.
